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a personal note from James F. L. Carroll, New Arts Program founder and director

This is our events calendar for the 2023-2024 season, our last. Enjoy the read and hope to see you at the gallery.

New Art Program celebrates its 50th year with a series of retrospective exhibitions, film viewings and BCTV programs. The season opens in September 2023 with NAP residency artists from 1974-1981. January 2024 continues with 1982-1999 artists. The final exhibition, April-June 2024, features artists from the years 2000-2024.

New Arts Program was started in 1974 with visiting artists of all descriptions whom I didn't know personally. A unique foundation of the Program was that any member of the public could have a free individual one-to-one conversation with the guest artist during the two-day residency.

The Program completed fifty years with approximately 300 artists exhibiting in solo shows, many more in group performances, and hundreds more artists in the Annual Invitational International Salon of Small Works. In addition to documenting artists in residence, NAP has produced artist catalogs, books, video/films, and posters.

NAP ARCHIVES ACQUIRED

I am pleased to announce that the Archives of American Art, Smithsonian Institution, has accepted the New Arts Program archives for repository. During three visits from the Archives curators over sixty boxes of written and audio/visual materials which included all artists participating in New Arts Program were selected and shipped. They are now in the process of being catalogued and digitized for public access.

The Archives head curator, Josh Franco, came to Kutztown and interviewed me over a two-day period. Attention Sunday visitors: Archival film screenings at the gallery at noon. See page 6 for details. Over the course of its first ten years—1974 to 1984—NAP's residencies were held on the campus of Kutztown State College. Then, from 1984 to this day, NAP residencies and exhibitions have been held at NAP's own space, 173 W. Main Street, the space of this current exhibition. Eleven months out of the year, NAP has shown the work of first-rate contemporary artists from the US and abroad.

Adding to the visual arts mix, in 1979 the Program initiated the NAP Limited Print Editions project. In time, 60+ editions had been created by visual, performing and literary artists with the intent of benefiting the NAP with their sale. Several of the works in this exhibition are from that project which continued into 1985.

While each of the three 50th Season Celebration exhibitions is feast for the eyes, we find disappointment in the fact that we could not included every artist who participated in an NAP residency or exhibition during NAP's history. We would like to point you to the *NAP Review*, beginning on page 9, which attempts to list the entire roster of NAP guests since 1974.

Beginning with 1990, the exhibition schedule was expanded to add NAP's Annual Invitational Salon Exhibition of Small Works, later to become an International Invitational, attracting submissions from up to 200 artists annually from as far away as Japan.

From 1988 to 1999, with funding by the Pew Foundation, 61 two-day NAP residencies were held in Philadelphia at the Painted Bride Art Center, Community Education Center, Moore College of Art & Design, and Museum of American Art of the PA Academy of Fine Arts.

For our Late Years retrospective, we are left with a whopping 24 seasons to represent.

In addition to uncountable exhibitions at the New Arts Gallery, the Program has through the years mounted residency exhibitions at other northeast Pennsylvania venues including the Allentown Art Museum, Lehigh University, Northampton Community College/Bethlehem, Reading Area Community College, and, in Philadelphia, at the Painted Bride Art Center, Community Education Center, Moore College of Art & Design, and Museum of American Art of the PA Academy of Fine Arts.

Between 2012 and 2019, NAP expanded the definition of a gallery space with its Project Wall—a second exhibition area within the NAP quarters at 173 W. Main. The Wall gave the public a chance to view artists' works and ideas in progress, exhibitions on the fly, and other work that typically might not find its way into a gallery setting. In addition to her 2020 show, Patricia Goodrich, represented in the current exhibition, took on a Wall.



Since 1988, New Arts Program has been producing two live one-hour TV programs every month which have been televised to over 110,000 cable households in the Berks County area and streamed live over www.bctv.org. Over 450 NAP programs have been produced at Berks Community TV in Reading since our first airing.

Our flagship series, **New Arts Alive**, featured a single guest a painter, sculptor, writer, poet, critic, architect, choreographer, dancer, musician, composer, performance artist, curator, or gallery dealer—in conversation about their passion of how and why they do what they do. Just about every NAP residency artist has appeared in an episode, presenting and talking about their work. NAP director **James Carroll** was "Alive's" host with critic **Ron Shira** often filling in.

In 1992, a second series was added, **NAP Connection**. Host Ron Shira interviewed regional artists and the Berks and Lehigh Valley arts scene's movers and shakers.

No matter who James or Ron's guest was—or what the topic—the conversation was guaranteed to be lively and thought provoking. Viewers were invited to join the dialog by phone during the live BCTV telecasts.

We'll miss the live telecasts as NAP takes its final bow, but here's a chance to see a curated collection of 20 classic airings spanning 35 years.

Founded in 1974, New Arts Program is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit educational art resource library, museum, and exhibition space dedicated to providing a forum for the Lehigh Valley and Berks County public to interact with today's major artists from the literary, visual, and performing arts.

Celebrating 50 years, New Arts Program (called the Art Series Program for its initial eight years) has brought over 700 cutting-edge visual, performing, and literary artists and critics from around the world to the doorsteps of the Lehigh Valley, Berks County, and Philadelphia. Highlighting the Program are performances, exhibitions, and one-to-one conversations—a unique experience which cultivates direct dialogue between artists and persons interested in the arts. To quote Philip Glass, "New Arts is a nonacademic approach to a nonacademic subject, and it works!"

Additional programs included internships, two monthly one-hour cable television programs, an art research and slide library, NAP archives, NAP Limited Print Editions, Live On Paper: Book Forms, a literary journal (N.A.P. Texts) and other publications.

CONVERSATIONAL RESIDENCIES

From its inception, New Arts Program has been instrumental in inviting some of today's most provocative and insightful visual, performing, and literary artists and critics from around the world to take part in residencies in Kutztown and at other southeastern Pennsylvania venues. Each residency spanned two days and was comprised of scheduled personal

residencies

This staggering list is comprised of people from the literary, visual, and performing arts who have engaged in New Arts Program residencies since its inception in 1974. Each residency included a public dialogue, performance or exhibition and two days of private one-to-one hour-long conversations with interested individuals-artists or anyone else from the community.

Over the course of its first ten years—1974 to 1984—NAP residencies were held on the campus of Kutztown State College. Invited artists informally talked about their work through tapes, slides, recordings, on chalk boards, and through demonstrations.

From 1984 to this day, NAP residencies and exhibitions have been held in NAP's own space at 173 West Main Street. In 1982, NAP moved its performances from the college to St. John's UCC in Kutztown, where they were held since. In addition to these two primary locations, NAP has scheduled residencies at several other institutions in the Lehigh Valley and Berks vicinities.

From 1988 to 1999, with funding by the Pew Foundation, sixty-one NAP residencies were held in Philadelphia at the Painted Bride and three other venues; see the key below.

one-to-one conversational meetings between the guest and individuals from the community and a collective dialogue in a public presentation/performance context. Visual artist residencies also included a six-week exhibition at the NAP Gallery.

ONE-TO-ONE CONVERSATIONS

During each residency, anyone from the community could make an appointment to meet for a private one-to-one hour-long conversation with the quest artist or critic.

PUBLIC PRESENTATIONS

On the first evening of each two-day residency, our quest gave a public presentation, gallery talk, or concert, which, at their discretion, might include new works, works in progress, videotapes, or recordings. The informality of the community space encouraged audience interaction.

NAP GALLERY

Eleven months out of the year, NAP showed first-rate work by contemporary artists from as far away as Tokyo and Romania.

1974 onward, New Arts Program highlights

Since 1974

One-to-ones-These informal hour-long conversations between a residency artist and interested individuals from the community form the nucleus of the New Arts Program. Each two-day residency allows for up to 12 meetings.

Presentations by each quest artist are held on the first evening of their two-day residency.

Art Reference

Library-Periodicals, catalogues, slides, CD-roms, DVDs and books on the business of art, studio materials, color, grants, art law, health, and safety. In 2007, renamed William Zimmer Art Reference Library.

Audio/Video/ Photograph/Slide archives-50,000+ works documented.





SPECIAL PRINT EDITION

In 2007 **Laurence Weiner**, colaborating with **White Crow Paper Mill**, created a special edition of forty signed prints as a fundraiser for the New Arts Program. Available for purchase, reproduced above.

NAP LIMITED PRINT EDITIONS—LOOKING BACK by James F. L. Carroll

In 1979, David Shapiro, poet and art critic, suggested making a print edition and using the proceeds from its sale to help fund New Arts Program. Beyond that, the intent of making the prints suggests that a process must be generated by persons with strong ideas—ideas that are more important than the skills or technical craft of printmaking. Shapiro's etching became the first of the NAP Limited Print Editions.

The central idea was to have artists work in a medium in which they were not professionally attuned. If you peruse the list of contributors you can see that most of the artists were not printmakers or even what we traditionally refer to as visual artists; instead they are innovators in the process of creating ideas, or what I like to call germs. For example, when Connie Beckley telephoned while preparing to make her print, she asked what books she could read about printmaking. I replied, "Reading technical books should not be your concern, but you ideas must be. An assistant will help you present you ideas—or germs—onto the printing plate. Don't fog your mind with technical operations or skills; just bring your ideas for saying something."

The limited print runs, which include some monoprints and monotypes, usually numbered four to twenty-five per signed edition. In making a print edition the artist is able to explore methods and materials outside their usual discipline. All the prints are remarkable for their ingenuity and idiosyncratic use of medium and materials. In fact, they do not even look or feel as if they come from the same printing house. Each is the work of whoever signed the print. A number were individually hand painted or otherwise altered by the artist. The printmaking assistant is simply there to help in translating the artist's idea or image. Students Kermit Oswald and Judy Geib were the instigators and stimuli for starting the production of the Limited Print Editions. As this venture of the NAP continued over a seven-year period, Eileen Baxter, David D'Imperio, Tom Sterner, Ralph Bailets, and Mark Innerst became the artist assistants. During the final three of those years, Steve Berardelli oversaw the remaining editions before the print editions program essentially went into hibernation.

During the mid '90s we resumed the Limited Print Editions concept with Live On Paper: Book Forms, a collaboration with Doug and Helene Zucco of White Crow Paper Mill, custom papermakers located in Fleetwood, Pa. The results were magnificent. Dancer/ choreographer Ralph Lemon had the distinction of being the first artist to participate. Nine handmade editions were created, limited to ten book forms each. A few of these unique works remain available for purchase.



NAP video festival

The **NAP VIDEO FESTIVAL** was a unique traveling juried exhibition of VHS art. We premiered it each year at the Philadelphia Institute of Contemporary Art. The Festival made stops at such fine venues as the PA Academy of Fine Art in Philadelphia and the Paula Cooper Gallery and the Kitchen Center for Video, Music and Dance in New York City. Entries were judged in several categories.

NAP tv productions

For years, New Arts Program has produced two hour-long monthly TV programs that were broadcast live to over 110,000 cable households in the Berks County area and streamed live over www. bctv.org.
